

Glen update 27th November . Portugal to Africa

After tracker silence of 2 days and presuming the worst had happened, the tracker has bounced back information to reveal that Glen is safe and well and was flying out at sea heading to Africa.





Glen left to fly out to sea from docklands at Péniche in Portugal at 9.47am on 25th November.



The route across the Atlantic Ocean



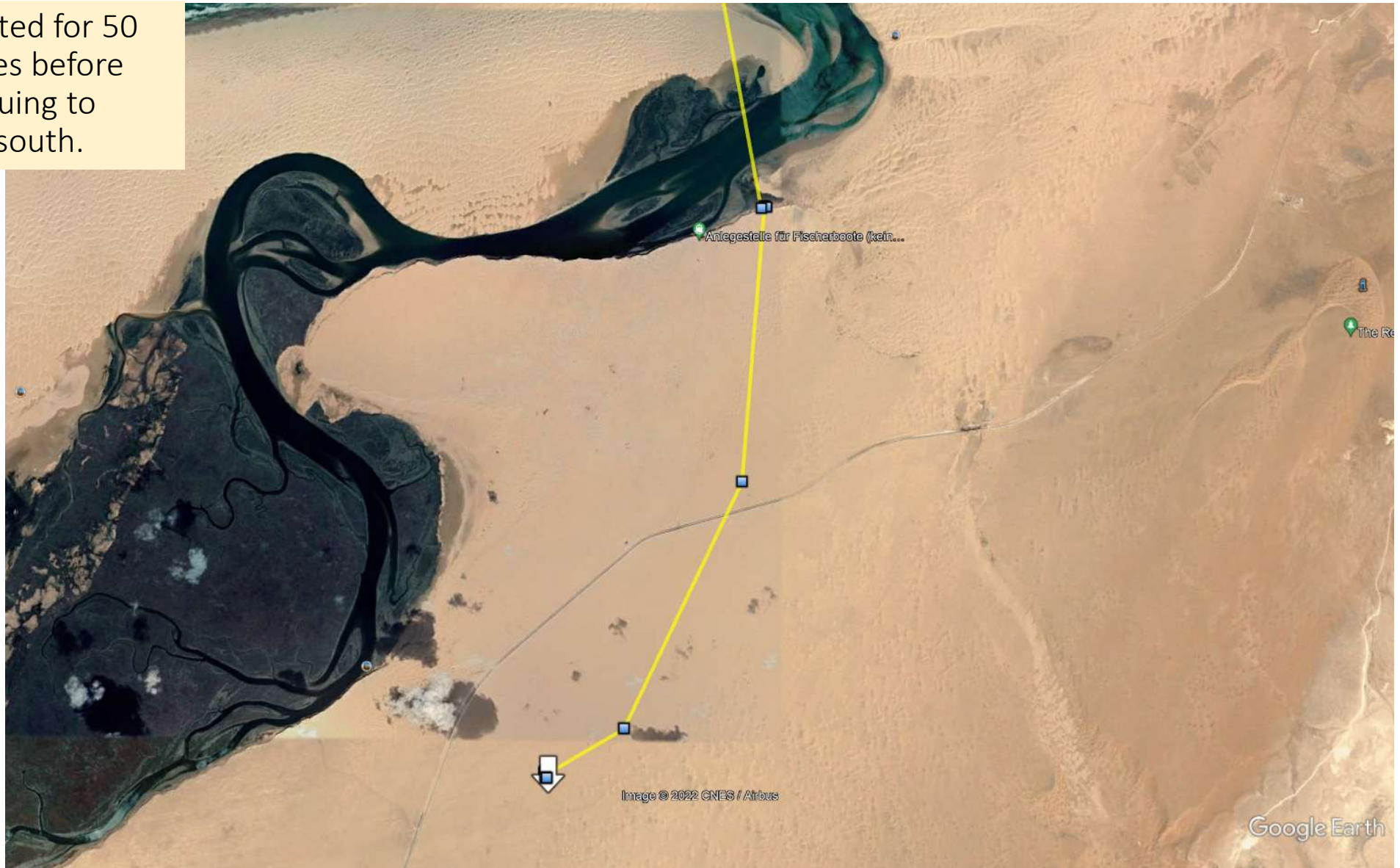
Glen reached Lanzarote at 6.30 pm on 26th November and continued to head towards the mainland shores of Africa



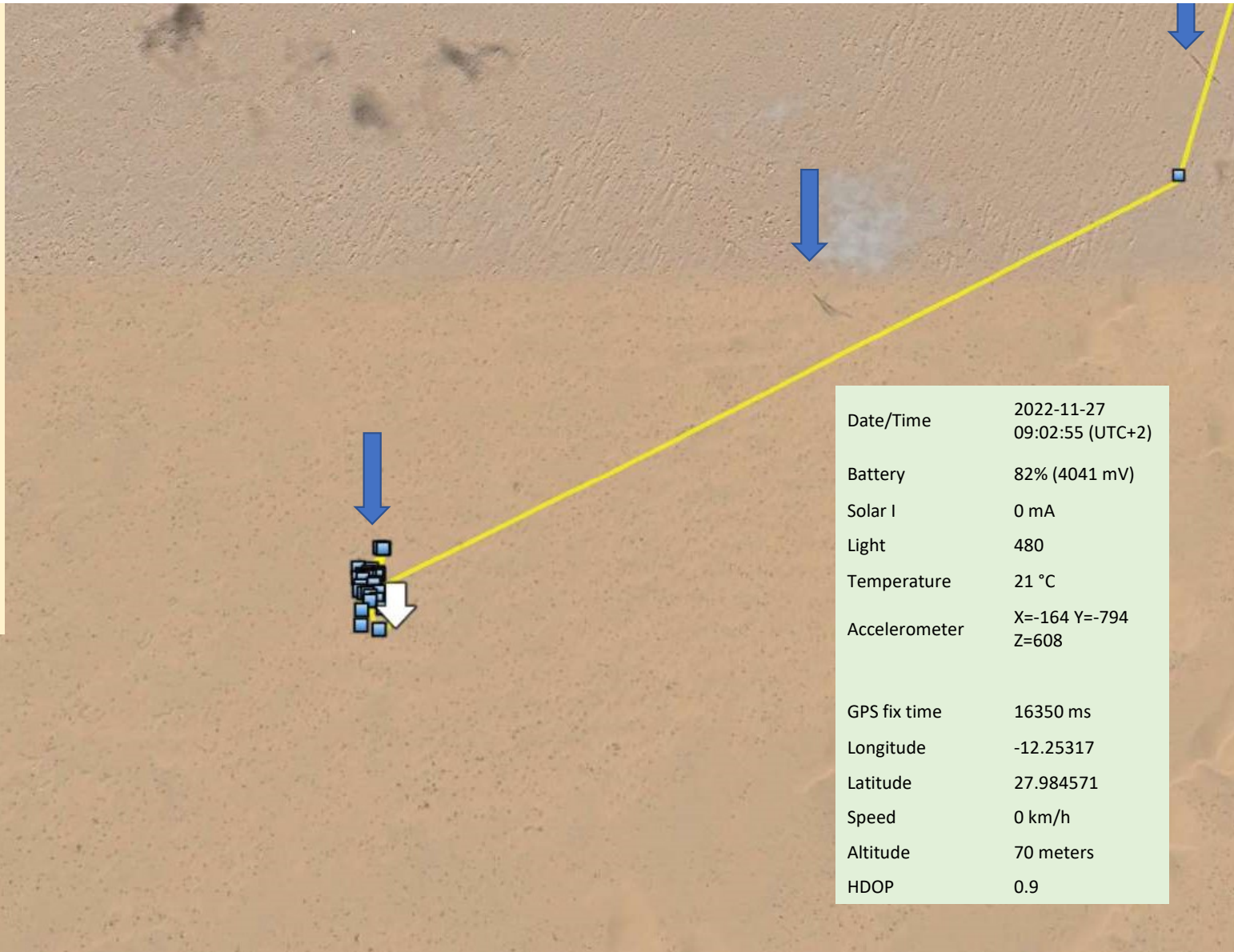
Glen arrived on the mainland at the Baie de Khnifiss Biological Reserve in Morocco at midnight on 26th November. This is an internationally important Ramsar site with nutrient rich waters and abundant fish.



He rested for 50 minutes before continuing to move south.



Glen eventually stopped at a pylon across the desert.

He stopped at approximately 2am on 27th November.
The white arrow indicates the last tracked position at 9am on 27th November.
