# RSPB Conwy bird review of 2013

### January

**The Water Rails** were showing well on 5<sup>th</sup> and a **Eurasian Bittern** was present 8-12<sup>th</sup>. Two **Whooper Swans** arrived on 13<sup>th</sup> and a **Woodcock** was seen on 25<sup>th</sup>. Two **Little Grebes** remained throughout the month.

## **February**

A **Kestrel** was seen on 6<sup>th</sup> and there were 72 **Shelducks** on 22<sup>nd</sup>. There was a flock of 11 **Goldeneye** on 17<sup>th</sup> along with 10 **Pochard**. Two **Choughs** flew over on 5<sup>th</sup>, a **Stonechat** visited over 20<sup>th</sup>-27<sup>th</sup> and the first **Lesser Black-Backed Gull** of the 'summer' was noted on 22<sup>nd</sup>.

#### March

In a very cold month, there were 10 **Ringed Plover** and 22 **Common Snipe** on 30<sup>th</sup>.

## April

There were two **Pintails** on 5<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> and two **Little Ringed Plovers** arrived on 15<sup>th</sup> with displaying seen on 22<sup>nd</sup>. There was a high count of 139 **Dunlin** on 4<sup>th</sup> and 10 **Knots** on 5<sup>th</sup>. The first **Swallow** was noted on 11<sup>th</sup> and there were 5 **Common Sandpipers** on 15<sup>th</sup> along with the first **Whimbrel** and **House Martin**. These were followed by the first **Sandwich Tern** on 16<sup>th</sup> and **Common Redstart** on 16<sup>th</sup>, **Sedge Warbler** on 20<sup>th</sup> along with two **Arctic Terns** and a **Common Tern** which was part of a UK-wide influx of terns, with many noted inland. More firsts of the year followed, with **Yellow Wagtail** on 20<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup>, **Common Swift, Reed Warbler** and **Common Whitethroat** on 22<sup>nd</sup> and **Lesser Whitethroat** on 23<sup>rd</sup>.

#### May

The **Great Crested Grebes** were on their nest on 5<sup>th</sup> onwards and subsequently reared two noisy chicks. There were 14 **Whimbrels** on 5<sup>th</sup> and a **Garden Warbler** was seen on 6<sup>th</sup>. A group of fledged **Long-tailed Tits** were seen on 26<sup>th</sup>.

#### June

By mid June, some birds are already heading south: a flock of seven **Black Tailed Godwits** returned on 15<sup>th</sup> and a drake **Common Scoter** arrived on 24<sup>th</sup>. A **Snow Goose** of unknown origin arrived on 29<sup>th</sup> and another **Redstart** was seen.

#### July

The first **Wigeons** of 'winter' returned on 7<sup>th</sup> and there were 60 **Little Egrets** on 13<sup>th</sup>. There were 360 **Curlews** on the estuary and a **Barnacle Goose** on the lagoons on 18<sup>th</sup>. Two **Green Sandpipers** were seen over 13<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup> and the last **Common Swift** was seen.

#### August

The **Wigeon** count increased to five and remained throughout, joined by four **Shovelers** on 17<sup>th</sup>. There were 20 **Moorhens** on 25<sup>th</sup> and two **Curlew Sandpipers** on 30<sup>th</sup>. A **Ruff** was seen over 13<sup>th</sup>-24<sup>th</sup>. Two broods of **Reed Buntings** were seen through the month, along with a **Grey Wagtail** and two **Common Redstarts**, and a **Nuthatch** on 26<sup>th</sup>. A **Stock Dove** was a good record on 18<sup>th</sup> and a **Wood Sandpiper** remained over 18<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup> along with a **Green Sandpiper**. There were 1500 **Swallows** and **House**

**Martins** roosting on 20<sup>th</sup> and a 1<sup>st</sup> winter **CITRINE WAGTAIL** was found on 22<sup>nd</sup> remaining for just that day.

#### **September**

There were eight **Gadwalls** throughout and a **Bar-tailed Godwit** arrived on 3<sup>rd</sup> remaining for the rest of the month. There were 62 **Dunlins** and four **Curlew Sandpipers** on 3<sup>rd</sup> and 6 **Little Grebes** on 9<sup>th</sup>. A **Little Stint** arrived on 10<sup>th</sup> and then remained until 3<sup>rd</sup> Oct. The 11<sup>th</sup> saw a **Marsh Harrier**, a good site record, and **Kingfisher** was seen on 17<sup>th</sup>. The last **Swallow** was seen on 22<sup>nd</sup> and a **Jack Snipe** was seen over 28<sup>th</sup>-29<sup>th</sup>.

#### **October**

There were seven **Red Breasted Mergansers** on  $10^{th}$  and 21 **Shovelers** on  $14^{th}$ . The **Grey Wagtails** were seen throughout the month.

#### November

There were two **Twites** on 8<sup>th</sup> frequenting the estuary track. Three **Scaup** were seen on 17<sup>th</sup> and remained throughout the winter. There were 13 **Ringed Plovers** on 29<sup>th</sup>.

#### December

There were two Little Grebes throughout and 30 Common Snipe on 17<sup>th</sup>.
