Welcome to our first Conwy Connections Bulletin

We're all extremely excited here at Conwy! We've been given the green light to plans that visitors, staff and volunteers have been dreaming up for years! The Communities and Nature project is supporting the RSPB with £179,000 towards a programme of work that we are calling Conwy Connections. Crown Estate has pledged a generous £55,000 to build a new observatory and the fantastic volunteers in RSPB Conwy Support Group have raised an impressive £30,000 towards the match funding in less than two years. This shows huge support for what we are proposing, for which we're very grateful.

Over the next 18 months, RSPB Conwy will be transformed with a fresh look and exciting new facilities, all gearing up to increase the connection between people and wildlife.

This regular Bulletin will keep you up to date with developments. We'd like you to be a part of this exciting journey. It's going to be great!

We go greener with solar thermal Completion: October/November 2012

Installing solar panels in the coffee shop is the first step of the project. Heating water is one of our biggest uses of electricity. Solar thermal for the Coffee Shop will make a big dent in the greenhouse gases that are emitted from the electricity we use. We will also save money on fuel bills that can be spent on wildlife conservation. The Coffee Shop will be closed for a few days in early October to install the solar panels. We'll keep you posted.

Improved car park

Completion: November 2012

We will soon have a much improved car park! Re-designed, resurfaced, a wider entrance, more blue-badge parking spaces and a safe footpath so that you don't have to dodge the traffic or the potholes anymore!

The reserve will be closed, only for a few days. Again, we'll give you as much notice as we can.

The Jubilee Nature Observatory Completion: Winter 2012/Spring 2013

This very special, green building will be built out of straw bales! It will offer a fantastic new indoor space, built into the bank with the lagoon opened out immediately in front of it. It's going to be a great place to watch wildlife, and we'll use it for events throughout the year.

Getting more from your visit Completion: Spring 2013

There will be new interpretation in the hides, particularly the Tal-y-fan Hide, a new viewpoint overlooking the lagoon and a fabulous art installation. We can't wait to see everything!

Y Maes

Completion: Sept 2013/Opening: Spring 2014

Y Maes is the centrepiece of the project. Situated between the Visitor Centre and the Coffee Shop, the current flat, brown-field site will be transformed into a sensory treat for everyone to enjoy. The hillocks and hummocks will provide elevated views across the reserve and the Conwy Valley. It will include a circular events space, a mosaic floor maze, picnic area, and natural play-space, including climbing area, water play and den building.
